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About the Butterfly Art Project

The Butterfly Art Project (BAP) is located at the Capricorn Primary School in Vrygrond, Cape Town, South Africa. We help traumatised children from the surrounding township to strengthen their inner resources. The image of the metamorphosis of the butterfly helps the child to better understand the issues of change, death, growth, healing, transformation, and their own potential. Children speak and understand in pictures. For a traumatised child, it is impossible to learn, to grow and develop to their full potential. They need professional help and to learn how to "FLY". This is done in the Caterpillar Studio by using the countless healing possibilities that art can offer us. Through the artistic experience of watercolour, chalk, clay, paper and scissors, the children develop skills for their daily coping with trauma as well as for their future. Life in the Township rarely offers the children the possibility of access to artistic materials that are necessary for the development of a healthy, creative child.

Art classes

Since 2011, the BAP has worked closely with the Capricorn Primary School in Vrygrond. In 2012 this led BAP to focus the entire line of art education and art therapy within the school, with the comprehensive support of the school and community. A team consisting of 4 full-time employees, 6 fulltime volunteers and 10 part-time volunteers made it possible to teach grades 0-7 for 40-60 minutes a week and to offer art therapy for the most vulnerable children at the same time. Weekly, 700 children from the ages of 5 to 15 years, were taught art lessons in the "Artloft" in the multi-purpose hall at the school. Drawing, painting and clay modelling can help the children with often very challenging lives, to grow from within and develop mental and physical formative forces. One of our large annual, community based projects, called PASTE, carries this artistic impulse into the township.





Art therapy

Aftercare

Art therapy aides the child through their individual process to gather resources from within and to develop other perspectives. In the last year, 79 children were able to receive art therapy and drama therapy support. Our kids have to live with challenges such as trauma, psychiatric disorders, physical disability, mental retardation and learning disabilities. Behavioural abnormalities show themselves in situations where there is a high propensity for violence, aggression, denial, withdrawal, seclusion, strong conformism or excessive desire for closeness. Every child needs a different therapeutic approach in order to strengthen their own creative powers. Therefore we have the various artistic media such as painting, drawing, modelling and theatre available. In a 40-60 minute individual and group therapy session, we were able to attest to countless healing processes in the past year. In the Caterpillar studio, we have managed through the art and the therapeutic relationship, to provide the children with an open loving space for enjoyment, trust, safety, rhythm, relaxation, vitality, curiosity and creativity.

Since September 2012, and in addition to art therapy and art classes, we provide afternoon care for school children. The social environment of the children does not normally offer a reliable and rhythmic structure for them to be in. This implies the need for a healthy and structured school aftercare. Every Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, children and young people are encouraged to participate for an intense two hours in artistic design, dreaming and movement. Once a week, trainees of the Waldorf education system, come in to enrich our lives by offering fairy tales and other stories. According to their age, the participants are divided into three groups: the Sunbirds at the age of 6-8 years, the Dolphins at the age of 9-10 years and the Elephants of 11-15 years. The key is 5 children per adult supervisor and intensive speech is guaranteed to them. A welcome and farewell circle with songs, prayers and rhythmic games let the group of employees and children grow together. In a few months, we became a cheerful and reliable "Butterfly Family".





Promoting school readiness

From January to December 2012, the pre-schoolers from the Overcome Educare crèche joined us with their teacher, once a week for a 2 hour session, plus volunteers in the Caterpillar studio. Most children from Overcome Heights live in shacks. The poverty is so great that the parents cannot afford the admittedly small amount for the crèche, especially when they do not have enough food on the table at home. Many of the children come sporadically for a few weeks and then stay away, sometimes for months. They are under great pressure to learn and gain the school readiness. The singing, dancing, clay, crafts, painting and storytelling in our program encouraged the children and gave us opportunities to produce specific individual education plans for the children. Through varied group activities the kids learned social norms and values which they will need during the school day. A few weeks ago we said goodbye to our little ones with an official graduation ceremony. For this occasion we rehearsed a few songs, and even put on a play. The children and their parents were very proud and were touched when they were allowed to wear the graduation gown. The BAP - team is already looking forward to the next group of preschoolers in 2013.

BAP building

It is a great pleasure to announce we started laying the foundation for the new Butterfly Art Project - Art and Therapy Center, on the 13th November 2012. Through the generous donation from the Smiling Heart Association and a bridging loan from the Vrygrond Community Development Trust, the dream of owning a building, with sufficient space for all the children and individual areas to be able to offer parallel therapies, was finally accomplished. The construction is progressing steadily and we can already dream our new home, in the new school year. This is a very big step for Butterfly Art Project and the foundation for new major changes to come.





Community Art Facilitator Training

In 2012, we offered for the first time a long-term training for adults: We trained 12 leaders from Lavender Hill, to use art as a Community-promoting material.

The leaders of the New World Foundation (an NGO active for over 20 years to enable a future in the township) have recognised that the art is an important medium for the healing of individuals and the community and they funded this course.

The participants gained insight into the history of art, engaged into widening their own artistic skills and they experienced many exercises for the creative interaction. By submitting an artistic portfolio, the participants demonstrated their skills and were able to graduate with a certificate.

Further education and Team building

In 2012 BAP offered the following trainings for educators and therapists:

Workshop for Teachers: Primary and secondary colours in watercolour

Workshop for Adults: production of pigment colours, different binders and fillers

Lecture for BAP team: fundraising for charities in the South African context

Projects

The PASTE PROJECT was a special event this year. Over several months, we were working with the children in grades 5 to 6 with different medias on the theme Fantasy Animals. At the end of November 2012 we pasted about 90 imaginary animals, with much fanfare onto the houses and walls of Vrygrond. They decorate the streets and walls until the next rain, and we invited the people of the Community to come and laugh at the imaginary animals.

The PLAYGROUND CONSTRUCTION was another BAP project in 2012. We built a playground for the children at Overcome Educare crèche. The sandy barren backyard was transformed within a few weeks, after a lot of sweat, strength, and wood into a small play area with slide, sandpit, climbing elements and colourful paintings. All over the ground grass was added, to create a child-friendly atmosphere, where the children can let their imaginations become adventures for them.

During the summer holidays we were able to offer the children a two week HOLIDAY PROGRAM about the theme "House – My Place". It was wonderfu to see how long and hard the kids could focus on the creative process. There were many "neighbourly visits" and the brilliant conclusion was Christmas amidst "Our Village."


Note of thanks






